# **GAWLER CROQUET CLUB – History**

An early croquet match occurred when Gawler was visited by Kapunda Croquet Club in May 1914 and the visitors taken to "Martindale", the residence of Mr Arthur Smith. Gawler was represented by Mesdames Bischof, A Smith, A Harris, Perkins, M Smith and Miss Rudall.

In August 1917 the Bowling Club put a request to Council to remove about 30 loads of sand from the North Para River for the purpose of making a croquet court and on February 2<sup>nd</sup> 1918 it was opened by the President of the Bowling Club. The croquet court occupied part of the Bowling Club land situated at the corner of Jacob and Reid Streets. The club was named Gawler Ladies Croquet Club and, as it was established within the Bowling Club, membership was confined initially to the wives, daughters or sisters of playing members of the Bowling Club.

In the following year 22 Croquet Club members were signed up. And the President was Mrs F May and the Captain Mrs H Bischof. Membership declined a little in the following years but matches were played against visiting teams from such places as Salisbury, Riverton, Mallala etc.

On February 27<sup>th</sup> 1929 came the official opening of Gawler South Croquet Club. Their court was part of the Railways Garden beside the Gawler railway station south of Gawler and its President was Mrs W J May.

The local newspaper on 8<sup>th</sup> of March 1935 reported on a new club formed at Gawler South and called Riverside Croquet Club. Mrs Porter was its initial President and the official opening occurred on February 20<sup>th</sup> 1936. Its location was in Seventh Street but in 1952 the land it occupied was sold and an approach made to Council by the Club for another site. This was provided on the corner of Fifth Street and Adelaide Road near South Playground. The Gawler Croquet Club occupied this site for the next 30 years.

From this historical distance it appears that two clubs operated simultaneously in Gawler and it is probable that the original GLCC merged with one of these two but it is not clear as to which.

In 1954 Gawler Croquet Club joined with Wasleys, Freeling and Salisbury Clubs to form the Para-Light Association and inter-club competition ensued. In 1967 membership at Gawler was down to just three players so in 1969 a breakthrough occurred with the admittance of a male member. The Club was to bounce back to the extent that in 1977 it requested Council for a larger plot of land which was granted. Accordingly in 1982, two courts and a new clubhouse on Hallam Drive were established. Club colours were red and white. Membership numbers however again declined over time and the Gawler Croquet Club closed down in 2013.
